World Wide Knit in Public Day, 8th – 16th June 2013

How to Knit an Aeroplane

Use any yarn you like but make sure you check the wrapper for the right sized needles.

Cast on 3 stitches

Row 1: K3

Row 2: K2, Kfb

Row 3: K3, Kfb

Rows 4-6: K5

Row 7: Cast on 5 stitches

Row 8: K10

Row 9: Cast on 5 stitches

Rows 10-14: K15

Row 15: Cast off 5 stitches, K10

Row 16: Cast off 5 stitches, K5

Rows 17-19: K5

Row 20: Kfb, K3, Kfb

Row 21-23: K7

Row 24: Kfb, K5, Kfb

Rows 25-35: K9

Row 36: Cast on 10 stitches

Row 37: K19

Row 38: Cast on 10 stitches

Row 39-47: K29

Row 48: Cast off 9 stitches, K20

Row 49: Cast off 9 stitches, K11

Row 50: K11

Row 51: K9, K2tog

Row 52: K8, K2tog

Row 53: K7, K2tog

Row 54: K6, K2tog

Row 55: K5, K2tog

Row 56: K6

Row 57: Cast on 3 stitches

Row 58: K9

Row 59: Cast on 3 stitches

Row 60: K12

Row 61: Kfb, K10, Kfb

Row 62: K14

Row 63: K2tog, K10, K2tog

Row 64: K12

Row 65: K4, cast off 4 stitches, K4

Row 66: Cast off the first 4 stitches, then the remaining 4 stitches

Glossary

K = Knit

Kfb = Knit into the front and back of a stitch

K2tog = Knit two stitches together
