
**Before you go downstairs to complete the rest of your worksheet, Take a moment to view the other aircraft in this hall from the balcony.**

**Find the plane on the revolving platform.** The P-51 Mustang was one of the greatest fighters of World War Two. Planes were often marked in the pilot's colours out of remembrance and respect. This particular plane, with its natural metal finish and 'Donald Duck' emblem, is marked in the colours of Captain Donald Emerson – a 21 year old American pilot who was killed on Christmas Day 1944.
