Before your visit

Before you bring your class to the RAF Museum, you may want to prepare your pupils by using some of these activity/discussion ideas.

- What is a museum? Has anyone been to one before?
- Why are we visiting the RAF Museum?

Key vocabulary which could be useful for your visit:

- Helicopter
- Rotor blades
- Gravity
- Directional language up/down, left/right, backwards/forwards
- Aeroplane
- Wings
- Propeller

During your visit

- Explore the Museum and encourage children to find examples of different types of aircraft
- In Aeronauts, children can experiment with a range of flight-themed interactives
- Enjoy your 'Helicopters' workshop (check your booking confirmation for the session time)

<u>After your visit</u>

- Create a display showing the different jobs which helicopters do and how the rotor blades work
- Pupils imagine they have travelled to a holiday destination on the Merlin helicopter and write a postcard to someone back at home
- Use junk modelling to create their own helicopter what job would it be designed to do?
