- In Hangar 1, visit the DH9a it was designed by, and named after Geoffrey de Havilland (he also designed the BE2b in Hanger 2)
- In Hangar 2, find the Bleriot. Geoffrey flew a Bleriot in the First World War
- Enjoy your Local History workshop (check your booking confirmation for the session time)

After your visit

- Find out more about a famous aviator linked to Hatfield such as Lettice Curtis or Neville Duke
- Princess Elizabeth (now the Queen) visited the Hatfield Air Display in 1951 – design a poster for the event
