- Explore the Museum and look at different wing shapes on aircraft – how do they help aeroplanes to fly?

## After your visit

- Create a timeline showing the development of rockets or space travel (don't forget Tim Peake!)
- Design a rocket which is capable of going in to space – think about the forces which will be acting on it
- Explore air resistance further by creating a simple parachute for a small toy – look at size, shape and materials for the best parachute
