One of two full-sized models built of wood, metal and plastic for display use. Used for some 61 exhibitions and air shows around the world.

- Model constructed from early January by a variety of Texas- based subcontractors and, following completion and delivery on 30 July, unveiled at Lockheed's Aero Visitor Centre at its Fort Worth plant, in basic grey colour scheme. Remained on display at Fort Worth for 1999, and returned there temporarily many times over the succeeding 12 years.
- Flown from the NAS Fort Worth runway, Texas (adjacent to Lockheed Martin Aeronautics) directly to Farnborough on a Russian AN224 jet transport ready for display at the Farnborough Air Show, Hants (held 24-30 July 2000).
- (The X-35A CTOL Demonstrator first flew 24 October 2000, and made its first VTOL landing on 23 June 2001)
