- Explore the Museum and encourage children to find examples of different types of aircraft
- Enjoy your 'Aeroplane Adventures' workshop (check your booking confirmation for the session time)
- In Hangar 1, there are small models of the aircraft which children can get in – where might they go in their aeroplanes?
- If the weather is nice, you can also make use of our outdoor playground

After your visit

- Make up a story about an aeroplane and record it for others to listen to
- Set up the small world play as an airport
- Read stories about aeroplanes and journeys
- Create a display showing some of the different aircraft which children saw at the Museum. They could paint, draw or make 3D models.
