Early Years Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1

Aeroplane Adventures EYFS

Come and join Flying Officer Swift (our RAF Teddy Bear) for an exciting aeroplane story and a lively tour around our amazing collection.

Teddy's Transport EYFS

Teddy has lost his uniform but he needs it for his medal presentation! By following the clues and visiting different types of transport, can pupils help him to find his uniform and get ready for his medal ceremony? Max 40 capacity (including adults) Early Years: Understanding the world.

Helicopters Reception and KS1 How does a helicopter fly? What jobs can a helicopter do? Explore these questions and more as pupils get up close to our amazing helicopter collection and work scientifically to make and test paper rotors.

Remembrance Handling Collection KS1

Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2

Magnificent Materials for Flying Machines KS1 NEW

What were early aeroplanes made out of? Discover this and much more in our exciting workshop where pupils explore and sort everyday materials to help them decide which ones may have been used in the early days of aviation. As a grand finale, enjoy our message streamer experiment and learn how pilots could communicate from the air. National Curriculum Links:

Everyday Materials, working scientifically, events beyond living memory.



Fantastic Flight KS1 and Lower KS2 From the Wright Brothers to supersonic flight, find out how planes fly and how designs have changed in the last 100 years. As a grand finale, make and test fly your own glider. National Curriculum Links: Working scientifically, events beyond living memory and changes within living memory. (This session could also link with Gateways to the World).

Your Local History KS1 and KS2 (Aviation in North London & Hertfordshire) Aviation was huge in North London and Hertfordshire during the 20th century. Add some real-life experiences to your Local History unit with our workshops. Explore the impact of aviation companies such as Grahame-White, Handley Page or de Havilland on your local areas.

National Curriculum Links: Local history, events beyond living memory, changes within living memory.





First World War Handling Collection

KS1 and KS2

Only 11 years after the first powered flight, aeroplanes took to the skies in the First World War. Find out how this new technology was used and get hands-on with (or dressed up in) period flying clothing to discover stories of the brave men and women of the air forces. National Curriculum Links: History.



Air Raid! KS2

Travel back to 1940 where you'll meet an Air Raid Warden who will encourage you to stay safe during blackouts, gas attacks and air raids. Explore RAF roles during the Second World War and try on authentic uniforms great for a class photo.

National Curriculum Links: History.

Rockets KS2

Give your class the opportunity to experience an exciting and interactive rocket science session. This fun, hands-on workshop gives pupils the chance to work scientifically to make and launch their own paper rockets. This session is ideal for looking at forces such as gravity, thrust and air resistance. National Curriculum Links: DT and Science forces and working scientifically.

Wartime Classroom KS2

Experience what it was like to be a pupil in a wartime classroom. Get into character and take part in a 1940s lesson complete with a strict teacher, arithmetic and an air raid. Come dressed in 1940s clothing for an even more immersive experience. National Curriculum Links: History.

Sky Writing Upper KS2 NEW

(Available from Spring Term)

Join in a creative workshop inspired by the experiences of people in the Royal Air Force and try out some reflective writing. Students will use a range of sources, including 'My RAF Stories' and literature and poetry from a century of RAF writers.

National Curriculum Links: Literacy, History, events beyond living memory.



Battle of Britain Handling Collection

Upper KS2

The Battle of Britain was the most important battle the RAF has ever faced and a turning point in the Second World War. Set amongst the aircraft, pupils have the opportunity to explore (and wear) uniforms and flight clothing and find out about some of the heroes of the Battle.

National Curriculum Links: History.

Pilot Skills (coding) Upper KS2 NEW

Do your students have what it takes to be RAF Pilots? Can they navigate their way around a complicated route and do they have lightning reflexes? Find out in our exciting workshop where students use a micro:bit and coding to test their skills.

National Curriculum Links: Computing (coding).
